Don't get me wrong, I wouldn't want to change anything about Christmas: carols, presents, lighted tree, message boards hanging beneath business signs reading, "He's the reason for the season," Rudolph, and chestnuts roasting on an open fire (does anybody really do that?).

For Christians, though, the real oomph of the year is Easter: the Resurrection of Christ is proof that God is as good as God's own promises. More than that, the thought of the empty tomb, with the sealing stone rolled away by the unseen hands of God, offers me an often needed graceful reminder: the stone was rolled away not to let the resurrected Lord out, but to let in humans with fragile faith.

God knows my frame, my weaknesses and frustrations, my inability to see clearly what God would have me do. God's promises in Christ were complete with the resurrection. Jesus could have ascended into heaven unseen; the empty tomb could have remained sealed and silent; but, those first disciples were hiding in fear, confused about what next to do.

Two services offered on Maundy Thursday, April 1

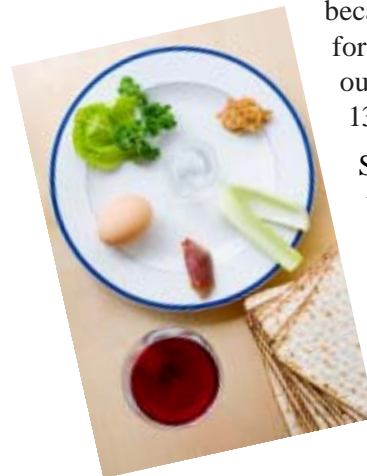

There will be two services on Maundy Thursday, April 1. The last service in the Community Lenten series which we are hosting will be in the Sanctuary from 12:15-12:45, with Rev. David Hill of Living Saviour Lutheran Church preaching.

The other will be a special Seder service to be held in the Charles Little Activity Building from 6:00 – 7:00 p.m. The early time was chosen especially so that children could participate.

The Seder is an intergenerational family ritual commanding Jews to retell the story of the Exodus from Egypt, "And you shall tell it to your son on that day, saying 'I do this because of what God did for me when He took me out of Egypt.'" (Exodus 13:8)

Seder customs include the drinking of four cups of wine, eating matza, and partaking of symbolic foods placed on the Passover Seder plate. Traditional

God's promises may have been complete with the Resurrection, but God's compassion for the frailty of Christ's disciples never ends. The empty tomb provided a jolt of encouragement.

The church is called the "Body of Christ" by the Apostle Paul. Every part of the body needs every other part to function well. And, when one part is ailing, the other parts team to carry the weaker part along. Said another way, the stronger parts become the B-12 shot for those whose zeal is flagging.

Sharon Presbyterian has many strong witnesses to the empty tomb,

many strong parts of the Christian body to compensate for each of us when we struggle.

May this Easter Season add zest to your discipleship. And if the season itself doesn't, hang on, be patient, let the Body of Christ lift you up.

foods served include three matzah, bitter herbs (or horseradish), shank of lamb (brisket or chicken), hard boiled eggs, Haroset (mixture of apples, nuts, and cinnamon), parsley, and wine (grape juice). An unleavened bread, matza is a cracker-like flatbread made of white plain flour and water. It is the "official" food of Passover. When the Jews were leaving Egypt, there was no time for the bread to rise, and the resulting food was matzoh. The dough is pricked in several places and not allowed to rise before or during baking, thereby producing a hard, flat bread.

Since the retelling of the Exodus to one's children is the object of the Seder experience, much effort is made to include children. The words and rituals of the Seder are a primary vehicle for the transmission of the faith from grandparent to child.

A Loss in the Church Family

Caring for our congregation

We are trying a new process of responding when the church is notified of deaths within our congregation and church family.

Death of a member:

When a church member dies, as soon as details are known the church office will activate the automated phone message system to call the congregation.

Death of an immediate family member:

When an immediate family member dies, the church office will send out a congregational email as soon as details are known. This will include notifying designated representatives of each of the Sunday School classes and Ministry Moderators, who will in turn contact their groups, making sure to include those who do not have access to email. Immediate family for this purpose has been designated as spouse, children, siblings, and parents.

Death of an extended family member:

For deaths of extended family members the congregation will receive information through the weekly email updates, the Sunday worship bulletin, and the monthly newsletter.

After six months, this policy will be revisited and adjustments will be made as needed.

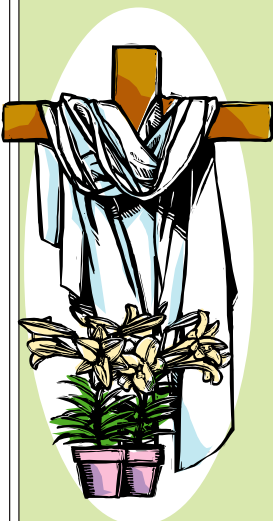
